Where to with the rubbish?

Information on the most important refuse types



Biological waste

Kitchen waste such as:

- **★**Fruit and vegebtable scraps, food left-overs
- ★Meat and fish waste including bones (not suitable for compost)
- **★**Coffee grounds and filters, tea grounds and -bags
- **★**Paper towels

Garden refuse such as:

- **★**Grass cuttings, leaves, weeds etc., plant and flower refuse
- This organic waste belongs either in the green BIOTONNE (BIO-BIN) or on the private garden compost. BIO-BIN collection takes place fortnightly in the winter months, but weekly in the summer-time (see *Waste-Calendar*).
- Only bio-waste free of impurities can be converted to a high-grade compost low in pollutants.

Packaging

- **★**Food and drink cans, caps, lids
- **★**Plastics (e.g. plastic bags, yoghurt tubs, shampoo bottles)
- **★**Clean polystyrene
- **★**Composite packaging (e.g. drink cartons)
- *Aluminium foil and lids
- This refuse belongs in the Yellow Sack (Gelber Sack). Collection is biweekly (see *Waste-Calendar*).
- Avoidance is better than recycling! Make use of products available unwrapped or in returnable vessels!

Glass waste

- © Please bring glass waste (not pane) to the glass container (see Waste-Calendar). The container accepts three fractions sorted according to colour (white/brown/green).
- Please use returnable bottles, instead of disposable packaging, wherever possible.

Paper waste

- **★**Newspapers, magazines, catalogues
- **★**Cardboard packaging
- **★**Paper shreds
- © Paper waste belongs in the paper-waste-bin (bin with blue lid). It is emptied every four weeks (see *Waste-Calendar*).

If there is a collection of paper waste by an association in your community, please have the paper prepared in paper bags, cardboard boxes or tied bundles for this collection.

** Write, print and copy on both sides of the page! Use recycling paper, as this conserves valuable resources!

Problem substances

- **★**Paints and varnishes
- **★**Household chemicals, pesticides
- **★**Fluorescent lamps, low-energy lamps
- *Batteries
- **★**Medicines
- © Problem substances must be taken to the problem substance collection point (see *Waste-Calendar*).
- Problem substances are a threat to the environment, so take care to dispose of them appropriately!

Residual (non recycable) refuse

- **★**Cigarette-ends, ashes
- **★**Vacuum-cleaner bags, sweepings
- **★**Nappies, sanitary towels, cotton tips etc.
- **★Light bulbs**
- ★Meat and fish waste including bones
- The grey residual-refuse-bin is emptied every 14 days (see Waste-Calendar).
- Tonly refuse for which a recycling path does not exist belongs in the residual-refuse-bin.
